- Make a 10-second video about why you love Girl Scouts and get permission to post it on social media



- Help register a new member to your troop
- Help start a new troop in your school or community
- Be the Girl Scout at a recruitment event: contact your GSCTX membership staff for opportunities
- Write a letter or draw a picture and send it to your local government official on the importance of Girl Scouting in your community and what projects you have completed
- Choose a cause important to you and develop a slideshow about it, share your slideshow with your school and local news, make sure at least one slide includes a mention of your participation in Girl Scouting and how it has positively impacted you
- ☐ Interview your region's Girl Scouts recruiter about what recruitment means and why it's so important to the Girl Scout mission and then design your own Girl Scouts ad
- Send hand-written invitations to at least five non-Girl Scout friends and invite them to a virtual or in-person meeting where you work together to complete or work towards a badge
- □ Wear your Girl Scout vest, sash, or tunic while participating in an outdoor event like hiking or camping and then share with friends or on social media why you love getting outside and how Girl Scouts helps
